

WINTER STORM BILLING Q&A

Will my electric bill cost more?

Yes, the cost of electric bills will increase for two reasons:

kWh Consumption Has Increased

- Electric heating uses nearly double as much electricity as cooling.
- With extended periods of temperatures below 30 degrees and keeping a home at 60 degrees, the 30 degrees temperature difference will cause your electric heating to run significantly longer, this increases kWh consumption.

Rates Will Likely Increase, But Not Drastically

- Our power supply contracts were sufficient to meet our member's needs. We did not have to purchase the increased \$9,000/MWh wholesale power you may have heard about resulting from this winter storm event.
- Natural gas cost did rise and that will cause us some increase in our cost.
- We are still gathering information and don't have all of the details. As information becomes available, we will share with our members.

What if I cannot afford to pay my electric bill?
